Akile Gürsoy is an anthropologist, BA from Durham University, UK & PhD from Hacettepe University, Turkey. Since 1998 she is the founding chair of the Department of Anthropology at Yeditepe University. Her career includes working for UNICEF (1980-82), visiting professor and Rockefeller Research Fellow at the University of Texas at Austin, USA (1990-92). She was awarded Distinct Success Award of Marmara University (1993). She was rector of a newly founded university in Istanbul (2009-11). She was elected member of the executive committee of the *European Society for Population Economics* (Rotterdam, 1990); Secretary General of the *International Forum for Social Sciences and Health* (Caracas, 2002). She was founding president of the *(Turkish) Association of Social Sciences in Health* (1998 - 2002). She is the national delegate for Turkey of the *International Union of Anthropological and Ethnological Sciences* (IUAES). Since 2009, she is a member of the Standing Committee of the Social Sciences of the *European Science Foundation* (ESF). Specializing in health anthropology, her research and publications are mostly on health anthropology, population issues, migration, and ideology in science.
